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A message from the President, Jeffrey Charles-Pierre

Brooklyn continues to experience an affordability housing crisis. It's a crisis in many ways built on Brooklyn's success, in its ability to both attract and retain its residents. New York City is being proactive in planning to accommodate continued growth and aging population to protect neighborhoods and to build the city's next generation of affordable housing. NHSBS is aligned with the Mayors initiative; "Housing New York" (200,000 affordable units over 10 years); a five-borough, ten-year plan for housing affordability. The initiative addresses key issues that NHSBS can identify with in our communities. It will protect existing affordable housing, discourage displacement, create more affordable housing and encourage collaboration with communities to ensure that they stay strong, vibrant and diverse. In the near future, NHSBS proposes to build on the current office location at 1012 Gates Avenue, taking advantage of the re-zoning, commercial district that now allows a generous amount of floor area ratio (FAR), to include affordable housing units. Plans include the current two-story commercial building expansion into a seven story, mixed-used building, with first floor commercial and six floors of affordable housing units. Details of this project will be launched at our 2015 Awards reception at Weeksville Heritage Center on Friday, December 4th, at 6:00pm. Hope to see you there.

Mortgage Scams

NY State Attorney General & Brooklyn Borough President in Partnership with the Center for New York City Neighborhoods Address the Issue with Brooklyn Residents

New York State Attorney General Eric T. Schneiderman and Brooklyn Borough President Eric Adams, in partnership with the Center for New York City Neighborhoods, presented a Mortgage Scam and Foreclosure Prevention Workshop on Tuesday, October 13, 2015 at Brooklyn Borough Hall. Homeowners and local community based organizations including NHS of Bedford-Stuyvesant, NHS of East Flatbush, Neighbors Helping Neighbors and South Brooklyn Legal Services were on hand to provide direct assistance to homeowners as they arrived for the event. The Attorney General (AG) and Borough President (BP) addressed the packed Courtroom, where they spoke to the audience about how to avoid mortgage scams, including deed theft. They were clear on how to recognize these scams and stressed the importance of filing complaints with the AG's office whenever possible. There were complaint forms available at the event for the convenience of attendees to take with them and use when necessary. Some in the audience shared their personal experiences and were provided guidance from the panel and other attendees. The BP assured the audience that the community-based organizations in attendance, as well as others not present, were available to provide assistance.

2015 VITA Income Tax Preparation:

From January to April 2016, NHSBS will host free weekly tax prep sessions as a part of the IRS' Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program. Households earning less than \$53k/year will be able schedule to appointment with trained tax preparer, submitting an e-File tax return on the spot.
